

# EARLY YEARS PUPIL PREMIUM (EYPP)

Did you know your childcare provider may be entitled to £387.60 additional funding to further support the education of your child?

Your child's early years education provider could get up to £387.60 per year to help with your child's education. This will be paid to your provider.

EYPP will help your child to:

- Benefit from extra resources and equipment suited to their needs
- Enjoy a range of new play, learning and activity experiences
- Be better prepared for starting school. Childcare settings will have to demonstrate to Ofsted how funds have been used to improve your child's education

## Identifying eligible children

You can apply for early years pupil premium if your child is aged 2, 3 & 4 and gets 15 hours free entitlement.

You will need to complete Part 6 & 7 of the parental declaration giving providers permission to apply for EYPP on your behalf. You need to be claiming one of the benefits or credits listed below to enable your provider to check for eligibility. Children may be eligible for EYPP if they meet the "Other Criteria" shown below.

EYPP Economic Criteria:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of State Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit ( provided you are not also entitled to Working Tax Credit) and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190
- Working Tax Credit run-on, which is paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit - your household income must be less than £7,400 a year after tax not including any benefits you get

Other Criteria:

- Children who have left the care of a local authority as a result of an adoption order in England or Wales
- Children who have left the care of a local authority as a result of a special guardianship order in England or Wales
- Children who have left the care of a local authority as a result of a child arrangements order in England or Wales
- Children who are currently being looked after by a Local Authority in England or Wales.
